### **YOUNG SCIENTISTS SHARE DISCOVERIES AT ISL SCIENCE FAIR**

The annual Middle School Science Fair opened to a packed house at the International School of Luxembourg on Thursday, 10 April. In the weeks preceding the fair, the 188 Middle School students worked individually, with partners, and in small groups to investigate particular phenomena of interest to them in the field of science. In preparation for the fair, teachers assisted students in identifying areas to investigate, focusing their research questions, and planning their approaches to the investigations. Students carried out the actual investigations during their science lessons. Parents, students and friends were invited to visit the exhibits and question the young scientists who had this to say about the event:

The Science Fair took place on April 10<sup>th</sup> at the International School of Luxembourg. Middle School students presented the experiments they had designed in class, for family and peers. A large variety of experiments including nappy testing, fruit electricity, and dizziness were on offer. Parents, siblings, and members of the community became “guinea pigs” during the evening, participating in many of the experiments. This was a great experience not only for our “Junior Einsteins”, but also for our greatly impressed and astonished parents and visitors.
